



Responsibilities of Participants



- Each Participant will be responsible for:
- Participating in such Projects as are mutually agreed upon by AHI and the Participant
 - Collaborating with AHI and the other Participants in good faith to implement the selected Projects and achieve the DSRIP program's goals
 - Implementing the clinical protocols for each of the selected projects
 - Reporting financial and clinical data to AHI to the extent necessary for AHI to meet its reporting obligations to NYS DOH
 - Participating in the governance process for the PPS
 - Cooperating with AHI in the development of an information technology strategy, and in the implementation of such a strategy
 - Cooperating with AHI in the development and implementation of a plan to advance cultural competence and health literacy
 - For Participants with additional rights and responsibilities beyond those set forth in the DSRIP Participation Agreement, entering into Scopes of Work that set forth the rights and responsibilities of such Participants, including, for Participants who receive DSRIP funds, the amount of such funds and the Participant's obligations with respect to such funds

Contracting for Needed Resources

Project 2.a.ii ~ Transformation Services / Supports

- Partner has in-house capacity
- Partner contracts with a vendor for the service
- AHI contracts with vendor on behalf of 1 or more partners
- AHI has in-house capacity; partner contracts with AHI



Project 2.a.ii ~ Transformation Services / Supports

- PPS will determine level of investment/support – independent of the type of contracting arrangement
- May, or may not, cover the full cost of the resource
- Could provide level investment, or a tiered allocation (e.g., based on initial level of readiness)
- PPS cannot guarantee full coverage of costs incurred by partner organizations ~ allocation method must be transparent and equitable



Potential Funding Sources

- DSRIP
- CRFP
- Partner Resources
- Other Public & Private Sources
 - Federal (CMS, AHRQ, HRSA, etc.)
 - State (SIM, etc.)
 - Private Foundations
 - Payors



PPS Partner Commitment

- Commitment to shared goals ~ at all levels of organization
- Partners will need to organize themselves internally for success
- Consider carefully internal communication, roles, responsibilities for PPS participation
- AHI establishing partner database to support more effective communications / engagement
